Directions

At Exit 121 (I80), near Auburn, go towards Forest Hill on Forest Hill Rd. Drive about 31.6 miles to Deadwood Rd. (39-10-39N, 120-37-44W). Turn right, drive about 5.5 miles and turn left (39-6-39N, 120-40-13W) (There is a sign for Western States Trail at turn). Drive about .3 mile and turn right (39-6-36N, 120-39-47W). Drive about 1.2 miles and veer left (39-5-41N, 120-39-54W). Drive about .4 miles and turn left (39-5-20N, 120-39-59W). In about .1 mile the road becomes 4WD, short wheel base only road. It is about 2 miles to the bottom with only a couple of turn around spots.

Notes:

1. All GPS() in these directions are WGS84 Datum
2. It is recommended you check in with Forest Hill Ranger Station
3. The last 2 miles is absolutely 4WD only, if in 2WD consider parking at top and using other method to descend to claim.
4. Deadwood Road is a logging road so be alert to logging trucks.
